Legislative Report

ABATE is dedicated to preserving the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what you ride. This 87th legislative session has been tough; however - that didn't stop Texas bikers from lobbying, in unity, to protect our freedom to ride. This has been an historic session for Texas in more ways than one. Texas had

several motorcycle bills (6 plus a resolution), which included HB 1837 and HB 1838 - a House motorcycle profiling bill, and a gang database reform bill. HB 1838 was only a couple days short of making it to the floor for a full House vote;

HB 1838 passed the House and was received by the Senate. The other bills all died a slow death in their respective committees. Overall, I would say that this 87th legislative session has been mostly successful for motorcyclists; however, it is vital that we take what we learned this session and prepare our strategy for the next session - which begins in January 2023. Mark your calendars for January 22, 2022 - for the Texas ABATE 88th Legislative Session Preparation Seminar (location TBA). Everyone is encouraged to attend – more information will follow. We need to work smarter - not harder!

On the Federal level, we need to continue "Taking Action" on several issues - not including the highway bill, which is a congressional mess; the existing federal highway bill is extended a month, and we will see what happens then. Bills that we can take action on immediately are: S.2736 (Re-introduction of the RPM Act); S.1853 (Motorcycle Advisory Council Act of 2021); HR 2141 (House version of the Motorcycle Advisory Council Re-authorization Act); and H.Res. 366 - Promoting awareness of motorcyclist profiling, along with collaboration encouraging and communication with the motorcycle community and law enforcement officials to prevent instances of profiling. Go to your elected representative's website and ask them to co-sponsor these bills.

Personally, I think this summer went by way too fast! In August, a


few of us rode to the 81st Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, and we had a blast! On August 10th we attended the 34th Annual A.B.A.T.E. Social Hour - hosted by A.B.A.T.E. of South Dakota. Only 7 miles west of Sturgis, this park is the perfect place to meet with likeminded friends to relax and discuss motorcycle legislation! Hardtail, from the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF), discussed the mc language differences in the House and Senate versions of the Transportation Bills. Thank you, A.B.A.T.E. of SD, for your hospitality, food, and drinks. It was a great turnout! And speaking of Sturgis, congratulations to Deborah Butitta (MRF A&E) who received the "Freedom Fighter Award" and was inducted into the Sturgis Hall of Fame! Deb is definitely deserving of this award!

September 23rd - 26th we attended the 37th Annual MRF "Meeting of the Minds" (MOTM), which was hosted by ABATE of Georgia; I gave the Texas State update, and discussed several of our bills. This event is always motivating, and the amount of knowledge that you gain from this event is amazing. At the MOTM the State representatives vote on the MRF strategy for the next year – High, Medium, and Low Priority objectives. I highlighted many statements and interesting facts in my notes. Gary Goracke is our new Rep's Rep, replacing Doc D'Errico. The bell-ringing ceremony was definitely a tear-jerker this year. Several awards were given to deserving members, and Mr. Paul



Landers received one very special award - the "Life Member Achievement Award". Paul has worked tirelessly on several of our Texas motorcycle bills and can be found involved in most Texas COC&I events. I can't think of a more deserving Texas Freedom-Fighter to receive this award - congratulations Paul! I received an award for the 2nd year in a row for making the "Top-10 Membership Recruiter" list for 2021 (actually, we had 11 members receive a recruiter award because of a tie). There were amazing numbers that these members generated! I like what Mark Buckner said at the MOTM, "Find people who make good leaders...challenge them...help them be successful...and move out of the way!"

Something very alarming that I learned at the MOTM is that Europe is planning on eliminating combustion engines by 2050! (continued on pg 4)

Many "end-of-life" theories for the combustion engine exist, and if that happens in Europe, I'm sure the rest of the world will follow. Look how fast electric vehicles are becoming popular, even electric motorcycles. How fair is a "by-the-mile" road tax for motorcycles? ORGANIZING A RUN... FUN OR FAIL?!

- 9. RUN DAY: There is a yard/parking lot full of bikes, ready to go, with the exception of a few:
 - c. There is one bro who is ALWAYS late and today is no different.
 LEAVE he knows where you are going and when you are going to stop
 - d. There is one bro who "just needs to do one little thing on his bike and it won't take 10 minutes".
 - LEAVE he has had plenty of time to make sure everything is right
 - e. So-and-so needs to stop for fuel, another's ol' lady needs to pee, and a couple just want to finish their smoke.
 LEAVE So-and-so should have gotten gas, while he's doing that, the others can smoke all they want and the ol' lady can pee

These folks will either catch up with you or slow you down.

- 10. On-the-Road
 - a. The front bike on the left will control speed, lane changes, stops and signals. This bike MUST have a good speedo, use turn signals, hand signals, and a horn.
 - b. Rigid frames on left, others on the right. Side cars and/or trikes in the back. The edge of the road is usually roughest and makes for a harder ride on a rigid.
 - c. Riders must stay about ten feet behind the bike in front but do not crowd. If a car can get in between the bikes, it will. If it does, be safe but pass as soon as possible. Do NOT wave a car into the line of bikes.
 - Everyone passes, signals, and points out obstacles in the road. Point out the dead skunk you go around, too.
 - e. Try and stay in the fast lanes on the highway. Usually less traffic in the fast lane.
 - f. No smoking, spitting, or drinking while riding in a pack.
 Do you want chewing tobacco in your face?
 - g. If riders near you screw around raise hell! Pay attention!

Well, that's about it. I hope some of these ideas will help make for a safer and more enjoyable run for y'all. If you have some ideas or good suggestions about runs and riding, I would be glad to hear from ya. Ride Safe & Remember: the more the merrier.

30-day Highway Bill Extension Passes

With the failure of Congress to pass a new highway bill, by the September 30th deadline, nearly 3,700 United States Department of Transportation staffers were furloughed on Friday. Most of these workers belong to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). Without dedicated funding to operate, those agency workers were forbidden from coming into work on October 1st. Operations in these agencies, related to safety and construction projects, were halted as a result.

On Friday evening, 10/1/21, in an effort to end the closure of these agencies, Congress passed an extension of the recently expired FAST Act. The 30-day extension releases federal funds so workers at the FHWA and FTA can return to work for the month of October.

An interparty fight between progressive and moderate Democrats created a stalemate on infrastructure legislation and produced the need for an extension.

This is the second time the FAST Act has been extended in just over a year. The original 2015 bill, expired on September 30, 2020, but was given a full 1-year extension, creating the recently passed September 30, 2021, deadline.

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) remains engaged with lawmakers on this important bill. The MRF continues to stress the need for action on the transportation policy Two Wheel World of Texas

priorities of the nearly 10 million bikers across the country. We will keep you updated as events warrant.

Chainsaws, Golf Carts, Lawn Mowers??? California (CA) Governor Gavin Newson signed a bill into law banning the sale of all off-road, gas-powered engines, including generators, lawn equipment, pressure washers, chainsaws, weed trimmers, and even golf carts. Under the new law, these machines must be zero-emissions, meaning they will have to be either battery-powered or plug-in.

This law is particularly concerning because of the status CA holds within the national economy. The population and market size that CA commands often forces manufacturers to react by changing products nationwide, to conform to CA standards. Additionally, states with like-minded legislatures often follow with similar laws and regulations of their own.

The MRF is concerned that this action by CA, will begin a cascading effect that will eventually result in the demise of the internal combustion engine and the fuel supply tied to it. During the legislative agenda setting meeting, held at the 2021 Meeting of the Minds, in Atlanta, Georgia this very issue was debated. Working with our state partners, the MRF is currently evaluating how best to address these concerns. The final 2022 MRF Legislative Agenda will be made public in an upcoming American Biker Journal.


DENTON RIDE???
